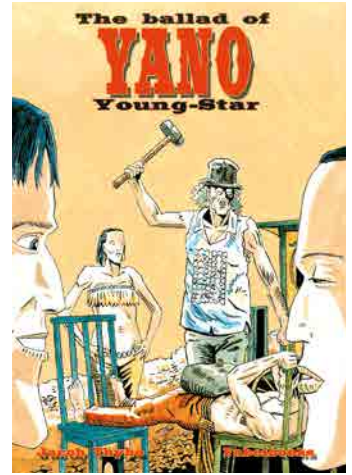
The Ballad of Yano Young-Star
